






Q1. As a general principle should pedestrians have priority in our town?






The Square: Confusing traffic flow and free for all plus excessive speed:






We asked: With population increase and resulting need for development, is the Cotswolds environment safe?




If not, will our future Cotswolds environment encourage the current high levels of tourism?




If not, can the Cotswolds current high quality of life be maintained?




We asked: Does the Cotswolds high quality environment attract inward investment and employment opportunities?

We asked: Will increasing traffic congestion and the resulting need for road widening and other improvement schemes, improve or damage our environment?







Planning and Housing


